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pleated skirts. They usually turn out beautifully. They also learn how to prepare a healthy breakfast. Mrs. McKinnon is one of Hosford's most creative teachers. She encourages her students in numerous fields such as art, botany, etc. Mrs. McKinnon insists that her students have a complete overall conception of the English language before entering high school. Miss Johnson, a very attractive teacher, has just finished teaching her 6th grade class the early number system, concluding with a study of number bases."

With an instruction staff such as this, it is little wonder that Hosford elementary has had outstanding graduates detailed as follows in still another student paper: "Susan Carol Hartshorn, selected outstanding student of the freshman class at Cleveland High School; William Burnell, 1952 West Point graduate; Jerald Wooliver, first in his class, Coast Guard Academy, 1955; Janice Ingersoll and others, outstanding in art winning awards in Scholastic art competition.

And this paper ends with the phrase: "Hosford School has in the past been extremely proud of its outstanding students and will continue to be in the years to come." We just might add: Hosford students also seem to be extremely proud of their school.
