Modernization Moves Forward

The Franklin High School modernization is well underway after a year of working with staff, students, alumni and community members to plan and design the school. Groundbreaking is scheduled to begin in the Summer of 2015 and a fully modernized Franklin is scheduled to open in Fall of 2017.

Transition to Marshall Campus

During the two-year construction period Franklin students will move to the Marshall high campus for the 2015-16 and 2016-17 school years. For the students, teachers and staff the buildings will be different but it will continue to be Franklin High School.

Fully modernized Franklin High School opens



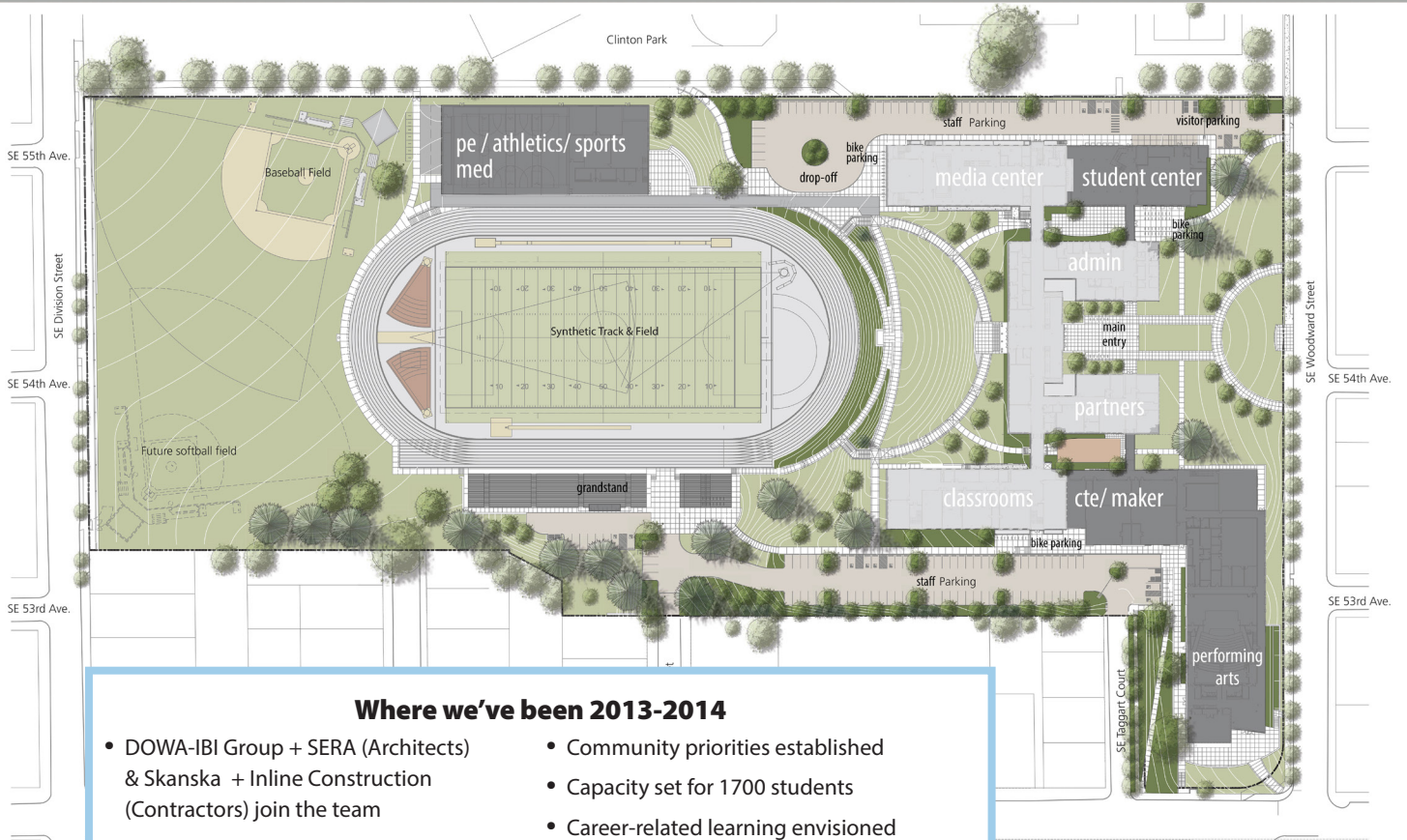
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NEW FRANKLIN: HIGHLIGHTS

- The plan blends its century old history with new, innovative facilities to prepare students to face the challenges of the future.
- A new Fine and Performing Arts Center will be the beacon of the modernized campus.
- A dynamic, two-story entry lobby provides students and the community a space to gather, work and learn.
- Spaces for Career Pathways in STEM, Industrial Arts, Health Science/Biomedical, Culinary Arts, Law/Constitution & Early Childhood.
- A 90 degree realignment of the track and field to accommodate new athletic and sports medicine facility.
- Repurposing the existing auditorium as the new Media Center to allow this majestic space to continue to serve the Franklin community.
