

MIGRANT PROGRAM

The Migrant Education Program provides help with education and other needs for children ages 3-21 who moved frequently because they, their parents or guardians work in agriculture, fishing or forestry.

Children and youth identified as migrant are eligible for Migrant Education Program services for three years from the date of the qualifying move.

The goal of the Program is to help children and young people overcome barriers resulting from frequent moves, so the children can be successful in their Education.



WHO QUALIFIES?

Children and young people ages 3 to 21 years old:

- Who have not yet graduated from High School
- Who move frequently with their families.
- Who moved so they or their parents could look for agricultural, fishing, meat processing plants, canneries, nurseries or forest work.

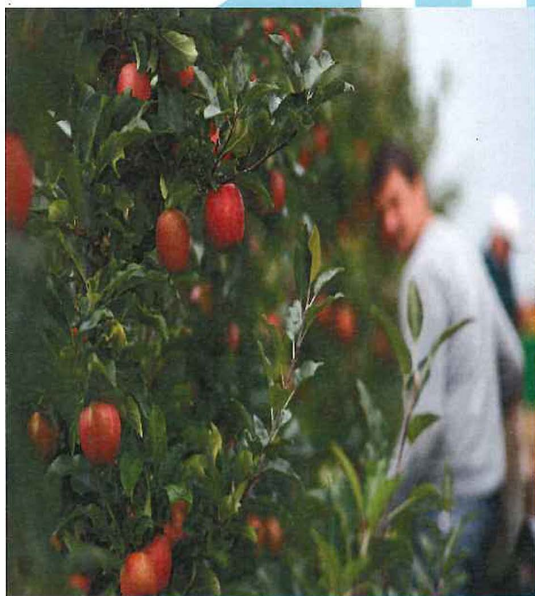
