



3.10.012-AD School Principal Duties – Instructional Program

In fulfilling their responsibilities for the instructional program, the school principal shall:

- (1) Meet district standard to serve as an educational leader who promotes the success of all staff and students by facilitating the development, articulation, implementation and stewardship of a vision of teaching and learning that is shared with and supported by the school community;
(2) Meet district standard to promote the success of all staff and students by developing and implementing a school culture and an instructional program which promotes student and staff learning and CIM/CAM/PASS and benchmark achievement;
(3) Be responsible for the detailed organization of the school and for the assignment of duties to the members of his/her professional and non-certificated non-licensed staff;
(4) Lead the staff in developing and adapting courses of study and school programs to achieve the goals of the district and the school according to the special needs of the students in his/her school and district and state curricular requirements;
(5) Encourage teacher participation in discussions and deliberations regarding instructional programs in order that the instructional competence of teachers may be utilized in decisions regarding the instructional program;
(6) Encourage constructive and professionally sound instructional research by teachers in the use of new methods, materials and content;
(7) Encourage the staff to assess critically both old and new materials and processes of teaching in the light of student growth by helping them keep abreast of current educational research and by encouraging visits in the classrooms of other teachers.
